In celebration of African American History Month, Dr. Terrell Strayhorn, Professor and Director, Center for Higher Education Enterprise at The Ohio State University will discuss *The Mis-Education of the Negro*, the seminal work of Professor Carter G. Woodson, the founder of Black History Month, providing discussion about how this work applies to the #BlackLivesMatter and Black student protests of today. Strayhorn served as a Visiting Scholar in the Carter G. Woodson Institute for African American Studies at the University of Virginia.
